Klondike Derby Stations

Klondike derby is an annual event held for Webelos II and Boy Scouts during the winter months. The event consists of a series of stations where patrols test their skills and leadership abilities, earning points towards a total score. This year's stations include:

Compass, Duck tape 101, Fire, First Aid, Leave No Trace, Saw and Axe, Wilderness Survival and Rustic Sled

- Webelos II may compete on their own or with a Troop.
- Webelos II that are on their own will need a 5:1 Scout to adult ratio.
- Each patrol should bring a patrol flag embellished with this year's theme.
- Extra credit will be given for rustic sleds (sleds made of all natural materials).
- Lunch will be from 11am-12:30pm. Cook a warm meal for you and your judges.
- Overnight camping on your own is optional for Friday night.

Equipment List

- 1.** Sled with attached towing bridle, must have runner and Troop/Pack numbers
- 2.** Six ropes, each at least 6 ft. long
- 3.** Patrol first aid kit
- 4.** Compass
- 5.** 1 Scout Handbook
- 6.** Patrol flag mad by the patrol with this year's theme
- 7.** Pencil, notebook, pocketknife, totin' chip card
- 8.** List of boys in the patrol that day (name and rank)
- 9.** One blanket
- 10.** Tarp (big enough for the patrol) 9 x 9
- 11.** Food and water- enough for patrol and 2 judges
- 12.** Eating utensils for all members of patrol and judges
- 13.** Twine or rope
- 14.** Tinder, kindling, matches or Hot Spark
- 15.** Scouts dressed for the weather
- 16.** Six 5 ft. poles
- 17.** Trail food (optional)
- 18.** Some way to keep equipment in the sled
- 19.** 1 orange and 1 egg

ANY PERSON NOT PROPERLY DRESSED WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO GO ON THE TRAIL.

Each Scout and adult must have this equipment

1. Warm clothes- dress in layer (bring face protection)
2. Proper footwear (No tennis shoes)
3. Water for drinking

NOTE: This is a private farm. There is no food or water available. A port-a-john will be on site. Remember leave no trace! Pack it in...pack it out.
